BURYING THE BONES by HILARY SPURLING, *Profile* £15 Spurling breathes new life into forgotten Nobel prize-winner Pearl S Buck in her dazzling biography.

HAROLD LARWOOD by DUNCAN HAMILTON *Quercus* £8.99 Magnificent life of the fast bowler who took the blame for the 1932-3 "bodyline" series.

KEEPER by ANDREA GILLIES, *Short Books* £8.99 Winner of this year's Orwell prize, Gillies's account of caring for her dementia-suffering mother-in-law is compelling.

YOUNG ROMANTICS by DAISY HAY, *Bloomsbury* £20 Byron and Shelley are the villains of this fresh and vivid group portrait.

DANCING TO THE PRECIPICE by CAROLINE MOOREHEAD *Vintage* £10.99 Enthralling look at the sharp-eyed 19th-century memoirist Lucie de la Tour du Pin.

TRAUTMANN'S JOURNEY by CATRINE CLAY, *Yellow Jersey* £16.99 The remarkable life — as paratrooper and fascist — of Man City's famous German goalie.

SEASONAL SUICIDE NOTES by ROGER LEWIS, *Short Books* £7.99 Brilliantly funny, bad-tempered

memoir, full of bile, jealousy and great reservoirs of melancholy.

JUST KIDS by PATTI SMITH *Bloomsbury* £18.99 Smith's elegiac tribute to her childlike New York romance with the photographer Robert Mapplethorpe in the 1970s.

THE WORST DATE EVER by JANE BUSSMANN, *Pan* £7.99 Wickedly funny chronicle of the author's amorous pursuit of a chisel-jawed peace negotiator.
